- Submission Window: September 5, 2017-June 29, 2018
  - KSDE's Best Practice Recommendation is to submit TEST records after the fall semester ends. Ideally, this will occur once students and staff return from your Christmas/Holiday break.
- The student data that is submitted for TEST should be current as of the day the student takes an assessment
- Accountability School or Attendance School
- When both the Accountability and Attendance buildings submit TEST records for the same student for the same test subject, the last record submitted will be used to generate the test ticket in KITE

- Grades 3-11 who are eligible to take the State assessments
  - Grades K-12 who are eligible to take the KELPA2 assessment

- Students entering a school after a specific date DO NOT have to be tested:
  - March 13, 2018 Summative: Math, ELA and Science
  - January 31, 2018 DLM: Math, ELA and Science
  - KELPA2 No: "DO NOT TEST DATE"



 The current TEST record and test subject will be used to provide information to CETE for State assessment test tickets

 The assessment results of all submitted to KIDS on TEST records will be counted towards the Accountability School by KSDE for accountability purposes

• The demographic fields from the most recently submitted TEST record are used to determine student sub-groups for accountability purposes.

- Common TEST Current Issues
  - Q: I get the error "Educator ID not valid in EDCS..." however our educators have been here for years.
  - A: What this means is that the district staff have possibly not rolled over the educators for the current year. Please check with those at the district level, those who have access to EDCS



### **EXIT Reminders**

- Submission Window: Anytime the KIDS Collection System is open
- As soon as possible after the student's last day in membership.
- <u>EXIT/Withdrawal Date</u>: Schools are required to report an EXIT/Withdrawal Date of the student's last day of membership or the date on which the student was graduated or the date on which a student with disabilities met district graduation requirements for a regular diploma.
  - EXIT/Withdrawal dates are to be indicators of when a student's affiliation with a school ended, not an indication of the date a school submitted the EXIT record to KIDS.
  - Please ensure EXIT records are up to date prior to submitting TEST records.



### **EXIT Reminders**

- Common EXIT Issues
  - Q What is the legal time we wait to exit a student...2 weeks?
  - A There is no actual legal timeframe just KSDE's recommendation. While KSDE provides a 2 week guideline, they understand the school/district knows it's students better and may make a better judgement on when to exit the students who are absent for a particular amount of time. The issues of truancy and or dropout/non-graduate need to be considered when making exit decisions.
