MILT Collection Overview

The W's

Who submits MILT Data?

- Funding School of military dependent students, schools, or districts
- Not for Accredited Private Schools

Who to submit?

- Grades Pre-K-12
 - Dependents of active, full-time military personnel
 - Enrolled and attending on Feb. 20, 2018, and not included in the Sep. 20, 2017 district count
 - Submit either enrolled and attending Feb 20 or only those meeting "child of military family" definition
 - Submitting in all "Child of Military" students may include Sep 20 count students, but will not result in error

Why is MILT Collected?

- Gathers student enrollment data for districts whose student population increases after the September 20 (ENRL) funding count due to military movement.
 - Excluding virtual students



What is MILT Data used for?

 Determines if a district is eligible for additional funding due to military movement since Sep 20



When is MILT Collected?

- February 20 March 9, 2018
- Data should be current as of February 20, 2018





Early Learning Information

- Early Learning Participant (Required for students in grades 00-04)
 - This data creates awareness of students being served in early learning programs
 - This field indicates if the student participates or participated in a district sponsored pre-K program (i.e. such as Head Start, a district childcare center, Peer Model/Mentor, or other program), but **not** Kansas Parent Education Program
- Kansas Parent Education Program Participant (formerly Parents as Teachers Program)
 - This data creates awareness of students being served in a specific family program
 - Indicates if the child's family participates or participated in the Kansas Parent Education Program

School Entry Date

Should be based on date student entered the Funding School

Eligibility for National School Lunch Program:

- Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) schools should report students eligible for free or reduced lunch based on Direct Certification or on the State At-Risk application
- State At-Risk application is verified during auditing process
- NonCEP schools = no change in reporting data
- CEP schools do NOT report 100% as the field collects a student's eligibility, only not how pays

Definition of Military Personnel

- "a person who is a dependent of a full-time, active- duty member of the military service,
- or a dependent of a member of any of the US military reserve forces who has been ordered to active duty."

Weighted Funding

 February 20 count is treated like the September 20 count for enrollment purposes; includes all weighted items (i.e. vocational, bilingual, and transportation)

Military Attendance Requirements

- A student (Child of Military Family) must be enrolled and attending on February 20
 If absent on February 20, then attendance must be on or after February 1 and
- If absent on February 20, then attendance must be on or after February 1 and once after February 20 but on or before March 4.

Military Funding Eligibility Criteria

- Districts meeting increased enrollment of 25 FTE military dependent students or increase of military dependent students equal to 1% or more of the district's total September 20FTE
- District's enrollment count for funding is increased by the number of military dependent students enrolled and attending on February 20, 2018 not counted on the September 20
- Refer to "Student of Military Families—District Eligibility for Additional Funding" Report



FTE vs. Headcount

 The 25 student increase and military student enrollment increase of 1% or more above September 20 enrollment is based on FTE only

Career and Technical Education Contact Minutes

- Report minutes a student received instruction in an approved for funding CTE course or State approved course on February 20
- Not approved CTE courses through a post-secondary institution
- Concurrent enrollment CTE courses are not included in the funding calculations

Miles Transported

- Report all students transported at the district's expense
- Report miles transported even if under 2.5 miles or from outside the district
- Students 2.5 miles or greater should fill in the Student's Transportation Street Address and Student's Transportation City
- Seats or an alternate transportation modes must be provided for each student counted on the transportation list
 - Applies to Miles Transported and Transportation FTE
 - Students do not have to actually ride the bus, but opportunity must be available



Miles Transported

- Students enrolled in public and private schools counted for same FTE on bus transportation report as enrollment is counted in the public school
- Kindergarten students counted as 1.0 FTE for transportation to and from attendance center at the district's expense, or if parent reimbursement provided



Miles Transported

- Student transported by SpEd and regular transportation on February 20; one way by each are claimed 0.5 on regular route and claimed on SpEd transportation Form 308 (actual costs are kept for the other half of trip)
- Technical school or community college transportation Do not include



Non-resident Transportation

 2.5 miles or greater - Parent/legal guardian of a pupil, who lives 2.5 plus miles from normal attendance center within their resident district, may apply to education board of receiving school district for transportation to be furnished










MILT Reports: Accepted Records (Batch)

Accepted Records by Type




MILT Reports:

This report shows the FEB 20th MILT FTE compared to the September 20th ENRL FTE, the percent change, and whether or not the district is qualified for additional MILT funding based on the data that they have submitted. At least 1% MILT FTE qualifies for additional funding. A total MILT FTE >= 25 qualifies for additional funding.


