2023 Changes on MILT

- Virtual Education Student
- Concurrent High School Enrollment
- First Language (7 NEW languages!)
- Language Instruction Program Type



Students to Submit

- Full-time active duty dependents
- Enrolled and attending
- May submit
 - All Feb. 20 students
 - Only Military Student Indicator students



Who Submits & When

- Who – Funding School – military dependent
- When – February 20 – March 13, 2023
 - Status as of February 20



Why

- Identify military dependent students
- District eligible for additional funding
 - 25 FTE
 - 1% \geq from Sept 20

CTE Contact Minutes

- CTE funding approved courses
- Not included
 - Post-secondary institution
 - Concurrent HS Enrollment CTE courses
 - (KSDE Funding Calculations)



Definition of Military Personnel

- Qualifier: Dependent of parent ordered to Active Duty
- Allowable Values
 - '0' = Not military connected
 - '1' = Full time active duty
 - '2' = Part time



Eligibility for National School Lunch Program and/or At-Risk Funding

- Eligibility
 - Direct Certification
 - NSLP application
- CEP Schools
 - Do not report 100%
 - Only eligible – Household Economic Survey



First Instructional Date

- MILT Qualifying Conditions
 - Primary Disability = 'WD'
 - Gifted Student = 'GI'
 - Residence of Homeless... > 0
 - Military Connected ... > 0
 - Immigrant Student > 0
- Blank if none of these conditions

FTE vs Headcount

- Increase of 25 and 1% or more
 - Based on FTE not headcount



Immigrant Student

- Qualifications
 - Age 3 - 21
 - Not born in US
 - Not attending a US school for > 3 years
 - Foreign Exchange students



KPAT

- Awareness purposes
- State-funded PAT
- Any participation
- Grade levels 00-04, 33 (except 03)



KPP

- Participates(ed) in KPP
- Grade levels 01-04, 33 (except 03)



Miles Transported

- Address
- Seat or alternate transportation
- Public and private student – 1.0 FTE



Miles Transported

- Kindergartners – 1.0 FTE
- SpEd students - .5 for Form 308
- Technical school/Community College – 0.0 FTE



Military Attendance & Military Connected Student

- Military Attendance Requirements
 - Enrolled and attending Feb. 20
 - Absent Feb. 20 - > Feb 1 & > Feb 20; <=/ Mar 4
- Military Connected Student Indicator
 - Active Duty
 - Reserve or National Guard
 - Federal reporting



Military Funding Eligibility Criteria

- 25 FTE or 1% \geq Increase
 - State funding increased by student increase
 - Report: Student of Military Families-District Eligibility for Additional Funding



Non-resident Transportation & Residence of Homeless...

- Non-resident Transportation
 - Residence closer to another district
 - Application to other district
- Residence of Homeless Students while Homeless
 - Nighttime residence
 - Loss of housing at any time of school year



School Entry Date & Weighted Funding

- School Entry Date – date entered Funding School
- Weighted Funding
 - Similar to Sep 20 count date
 - All similar weighted items

- MILT Specific
 - Student of Military Families-District Eligibility for Additional Funding
 - Virtual Education Students (MILT)
- Standard
 - Accepted Records by Type-MILT

- ACT / ACT WorkKeys Assessment
 - Reported through Pearson ONLY
- Dynamic Learning Map (DLM):
 - Through KITE only
- Interim predictive assessments (TASC)



Assessments - General

- Career Tech Ed Pathways Assessments (cPass):
 - Grade Levels 14 - 17
- English Language Arts (ELA) and Math Assessments:
 - Grade Levels 8 - 13, and 15



Assessments - General

- History/Government Assessment:
 - Grade levels 09, 12, 15, 16, 17
- Science Assessment:
 - Grade levels 10, 13, and 16

All tests are delivered in Kite® Student Portal (except HGSS) and include multiple-choice and technology-enhanced items. KELPA speaking and writing assessments are human scored. All other assessments are machine-scored. Interim assessments are optional. General summative, Kansas English Language Proficiency Assessment (KELPA), History, Government, and Social Studies (HGSS), and Dynamic Learning Maps® (DLM®) assessments are mandatory.
