ENRL

The W's

What ENRL Data is Collected?

Records with Minutes Enrolled greater than 17 (FTE 0.1 or greater)

- Populates the school's Principal's Building Report (PBR) and the district's Superintendent's Organization Report (SO66)

Why is ENRL Data Collected?

Federal reporting

- Special Education (SPED)
- English Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) program participation

Why Is ENRL Data Collected?

National School Lunch Program (NSLP) eligibility verification

Evaluation of possible or future funding formulas
For KSDE K-12 and Building Report Card

Who Submits the ENRL Data?

- Public schools
 - For all students for whom they are the Funding School
- Private schools
 - For all students for whom they are the Accountability School (attendance data from the 9/20 count are used for accreditation)
 - In order to build their PBR for accreditation



Who Do We Submit?

- Pre-K through adult (including virtual students 19 and over)
- Active students (based on the September 20th rule)



When Is ENRL Data Submitted?

- September 20, 2018 - October 11, 2018
- Student data should be current as of September 20, 2018
- Records cannot be submitted outside of the submission window





EXIT

EXIT/Withdrawal Date

- Last day of membership
 - Last day of school affiliation, not EXIT submission date
 - Graduation date or when met district graduation requirements for a diploma
 - Previous school year if student does not return in the fall





KCAN - Migrant

KCAN – Course Outcomes

Course Completion for:

- Migrant Students
- Career Technical Education (CTE) Students
- Dual Credit course outcomes for high school students
- CTE Certifications earned by students
- Virtual Education Students 19 and Over



KCAN – Migrant Enrollment

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Early Childhood FAQ

At-Risk and KPP

The Kansas Pre-K Pilot Program looks at whether children participated in district sponsored pre-K programs other than Parents as Teachers.



At-Risk and KPP

Participating in KPP does not mean they are an at-risk student.

Students participating in private (not district sponsored) pre-K programs are not submitted.

Reporting At-Risk Students

Current Grade Level

04 = At-Risk 3 year olds

04 = At-Risk 4 year olds

National School Lunch Program

Determining eligibility is a district function.

If you don't know, check with your lunch program or the person in your school or district who deals with Direct Certification.
